

The Virginia Certification Board (VCB) has developed the following to outline the general requirements for certification in the Commonwealth of Virginia. VCB offers credentials that help a professional progress along a career ladder and offer many pathways to certification. While some professionals may choose to stay at a certain level, progression through the ladder comes with the proper experience, education and examination. Professionals may begin wherever their current experience and education level permit. Benefits of Certification through VCB

- VCB offers international, reciprocal certifications through IC&RC. We offer the ability to seamlessly transfer a professional's certification to and from other IC&RC Member Boards no other certification in the Commonwealth can offer reciprocity in this fashion.
- VCB's certification process allows professionals to quickly gain a competency-based certification by reviewing applications daily and on-demand, computer based testing. Professionals can take an examination throughout the year at their convenience and do not need to wait for specific testing cycles.
- VCB requires its professionals to continue their education. To ensure its professionals are staying up-to-date with best practices, VCB requires that their professionals seek continuing education to renew their certification. This is an added level of public protection.
- VCB provides public protection and a grievance process for those harmed.

Importance of Certification

- Certification identifies professionals who are specialists in the field, setting them apart from others not certified.
- Certified professionals are recognized in state and national insurance legislation.
- Certification is based on industry standards and evidence-based practices.
- Certification is a marketing tool for the professional when seeking employment or advancement.
- Certification is a marketing tool for the agency when promoting their services to the public, the client, potential clients, and payers.
